The Exhibition entitled Women's Press - Women of the Press: Women's Periodicals and Women Editors in Ottoman Space presents women's publishing activity in the Orthodox Community during the late Ottoman period and more precisely during the period extending from the first women's periodical publication uear (1845) to the dissolution of the Ottoman Empire (1923).

The Exhibition, based on the research conducted so far, includes all women's periodicals published within the Greek-Orthodox Communitu and their editors (thirteen posters for the periodicals and nine for their editors), as well as a part of women's publishing activity within the Bulgarian Community as sample presentation of it (four posters for periodicals and two posters for their editors).

The Exhibition, which is complementary to the Conference, visualizes the research outcomes on women's presence in the highly crucial public sphere of press and journalism. It aims at communicating these research outcomes to the public, thus disseminating knowledge on women's and gender history and contributing to its integration in public history.

The Exhibition is the result of individual and collective work, which was initially organized within the Master's Studies Program Education Theory, History and Policy of the Department of Philosophy and Social Studies and went on with master's and doctoral theses as well as with collaborations with researchers from foreign universities, such as Krassimira Daskalova, Professor at St. Kliment Ohridski University of Sofia. Part of the work of Krassimira Daskalova's research group working on the periodicals project, is presented in this Exhibition in the frame of the aforementioned collaborations

This exhibition could not have been accomplished without the artistic supervision and curation by Chrysoula Skepetzi, well-known artist and exhibition curator, the graphic design thoroughly conducted by Georgios Karouzakis and Loukia Alavanou, the willing support of the Organizing Institutions and the Regional Unit of Rethymno, the generous financial support of the Sponsors, and the hosting of the event in the House of Culture, kindly offered by the Rethymno Municipality.
